What we collect

When you contact us through our contact form, by scheduling time with us, or by calling us, we collect your name, contact information, and whatever you share about your legal matter. That's it. We do not collect information about you passively beyond standard technical data our website infrastructure records (like your browser type and IP address).

Why we collect it

We use your contact information to respond to you. We will not add you to a mailing list, send you newsletters, or share your information for marketing purposes unless you've explicitly asked agreed to it.

Your calls

When you call us, standard phone systems capture your number. We use it to return your call and keep a record of our communication.

Attorney-client confidentiality

If an attorney-client relationship forms, we have strict ethical duties under the Washington Rules of Professional Conduct to protect your information. These duties go well beyond what any privacy policy requires. We take those duties seriously. Even before a formal relationship is established, we treat everything you share with us with discretion.

Third-party tools and technology

We are a tech-forward firm. We use modern tools for scheduling, video calls, document management, and communication because they let us serve clients better, more efficiently, and more cost effectively. Some of those tools are provided by third parties that may process data on our behalf (for example, when you schedule a call or join a video meeting).

We also use AI tools to improve our internal efficiency. We are thoughtful about what information we run through AI systems and take care to avoid exposing confidential client information.

Our website uses cookies (small files stored in your browser) for standard functions like keeping the site running smoothly and understanding basic traffic patterns. We do not use cookies to build advertising profiles or track you across the web.

We do not sell your data

We do not sell, rent, or trade your personal information.

Washington state rights
